**Scripture: 1 Corinthians 15:35-50**

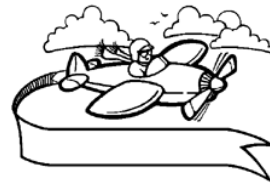

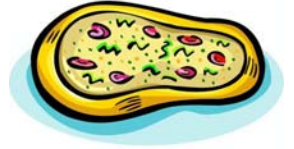

**Remembering...**  
**Mr. & Mrs. George (Margaret) Hayes**

(Reprinted from John Nicholson's series "Stewardship of the Month" featured in the Ambassador.)

I was almost blinded by the brilliant yellow daffodils and the beautiful red tulips as I went up the driveway at 392 S. River Rd. to do this interview. George Hayes is a Master Gardener, who plants the flowers each year at the point where SR 64 and 5<sup>th</sup> street in Waterville intersect. Together they plant 70 flats of flowers in the Parks of Waterville, at Pray Park and at the Village Offices. They also have a beautiful landscaped property which is a wonder to view.

George and Margaret, who have been members of WUMC since 1960, have taken a renewed interest in our church recently, and they say they get a most remarkable feeling of caring and sharing on behalf of the members. George had worked 39 years at Libbey Owens Ford and has been "retired" for 20 years.

One of the projects they have undertaken is maintaining the Fireplace Room, and the first project they undertook was to paint the ceiling tiles.....they were amazed that it took 8 ½ gallons of paint!!!

Margaret mentions many of the leadership roles they have had in the past. Notable was that she and George were co-presidents of the Adult Sunday School class when Ruth Wilson was teacher, and Mrs. Larry (Betty) Noward had encouraged them to do it. Margaret remembers Neva Utz, Marilyn Sawmiller and Erma Proshok when she first became a member of the Woman's Society.

They remember with a chuckle participating in an Easter play in the balcony, with Bob Welker playing the part of Jesus, and Ruth Wilson having him speak into a garbage can to make his voice more "Holy". They remember taking a portable organ to the Old Bridge for an Easter Sunrise Service. Their two sons served as acolytes and Margaret served as Acolyte Mother. The two sons also joined George as ushers when Rufus Utterback was head usher, and both served as pres. of MYF. Margaret was Spiritual Life secretary and coordinated the World Day of Prayer for the three churches. Margaret remembers working on Rotary dinners and Turkey Supper with Marian Morris and Norma Strayer. They remember serving on a committee to evaluate the Pastor's sermon after church (Bob Quick?). Serving on the visitation committee for the Pledge Campaign, they remember the professional person assisting say, "If everyone in the congregation was on Welfare, and they all tithed (10%), the church would have more money than it knew what to do with!".

Margaret was raised in a small town in England , and George in Maumee , both by single parents. As a war bride married to George in England, Margaret has a wonderful story of her wedding and coming to America on the Queen Mary with 1,500 other War Brides..... I'll let you ask her.

Their parting comments were to say, "Our congregation seems more friendly and caring than ever before and we feel more of a kinship than ever". Our congregation has a challenge to continue to live up to their expectations.

We are certainly blessed to have George and Margaret Hayes serve in our midst.

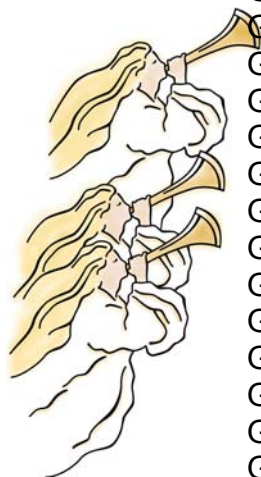
