From the Pastor's Pen

My old high school yearbook sits quietly among the many titles on my office bookshelves. *The Wahigan*, as we called it, has my senior class picture from 1988 in it. Look up my name in the index and you'll find out things about me you would have never known: other pictures of me include candid photos from our high school musical, playing for the concert choir, and participating on our Quiz Bowl Team.

Years later a college student named Mark Zuckerberg took the idea of those high school and college annuals and made an on-line application out of it called Facebook. In this age of social networking, Facebook has become quite a cultural phenomenon. With a few facts about you posted on-line, others whom you know can reconnect with you to learn what is happening in your world today.

What began as nothing more than a passing idea has become something short of an addiction, I confess. As of this writing, I have 200-plus friends who can read about the goings-on in my life and I can catch up on theirs as well. Just this week, I've sent birthday greetings to a friend in Ghana, looked at kids' back-to-school pictures, and kept up on the progress as another friend who is building a tree house for his boys.

You may love social networks like Facebook, MySpace, and others. You may have other opinions about them. You may not even understand how they work. That's fine. But here's the point: they remind us that **relationships matter**. Whether they are faces from your yearbook, pictures on a personal webpage, or faces you meet live at church or at your favorite activities, they are the thread that holds the fabric of our lives together. You wouldn't be who you are without them.

With age comes great appreciation about what truly matters in life. The older I get the more I've come to place high value on the people I've met along the way. Some relationships have lasted for decades and others only for a short season, but all have mattered at some time or another. Through each of their lives I am able to see how God has shaped and used my life to accomplish his purposes here on Earth.

This is one of the big reasons why I am very much looking forward to our upcoming study together called *The Relationship Principles of Jesus*. With 40 days of focused readings we will all share in walking the same path together, reflecting on our relationships within our congregation, our families, our network of friendships, co-workers, and so on. Think about all the places you rub shoulders with people and you'll be able to put these relationship principles to work!

Inside you'll find specific details and information as we begin our study together. Whether you read the book for your own personal and spiritual growth, participate in a discussion group, or just come to one of our worship services, my prayer is that you will discover one thing that will make your relationships better, stronger, and healthier.

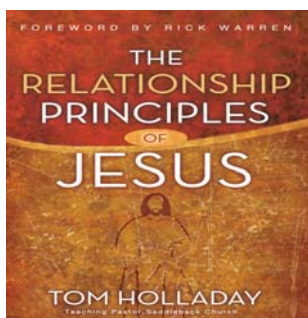

BUILDING COMMITTEE UPDATE

The Building Committee has been on a 'listening tour', collecting input in 2 major areas. The first is interviewing references provided by design firms we're considering to provide church drawings. And the second area is talking to YOU, our church's ministry committees and groups, about what you will need in the new church building.

We will be discussing reference information on the design firms next week, and hope to make a decision then on who will prepare the drawings and design the new church. This is a big decision. The firm needs to be capable of good design, and good at working with church's to understand what we need, to make sure the building provides the functionality we need.

Please continue to give prayerful consideration to what your ministry group or committee needs in the new church building. We urge you to take time to think about what you will be doing in the new building, because knowing what you will do will guide what the building must be. A good refresher to help think about your needs would be to look at the building committee presentations available on our website. While we will continue to do much of the same ministry in the new building as we do now, the new building will provide great potential to expand God's work. It's up to us to pray about what God wants to do through us, put the new building in place to enable it, and carry out His plans.

The Missions Committee has recently voted to help support Ali on this mission trip this winter. They would encourage the entire congregation to also encourage her with their financial gifts and prayer support.

Thank you for your support. I am really excited to be able to participate in the Medical Mission to Nicaragua. The trip will be for two weeks after Christmas. I will be in a group of students mostly from my college, Adrian College. We will be going to down to Nicaragua to help set up a clinic and work with a doctor to help treat people who may not have the funds to ever see a doctor. As a Spanish major and having an interest in the medical field, physical therapy, this is a wonderful opportunity to be able combine the two. Also we will each be selecting a general content area for observation/investigation while we are in Nicaragua. Topics that could be addressed are vaccination practices, nutrition deficits, water source/quality, health education, etc. The idea is that this will give us a subject to monitor and ask questions about while we are in Nicaragua, and form the basis for later reading/research. Personally I will also be using this research for my senior thesis in Spanish. This semester I will be doing research on Nicaragua and then in the spring I will be putting all my research together into a presentation. The trip I believe will cost about \$2,000. The exact cost is not known quite yet because the college has some funds that we can use. Also as a group here on campus we will be doing fundraisers during the semester to help reduce the cost as well. Thank you so much for all your help.

Farewell Party

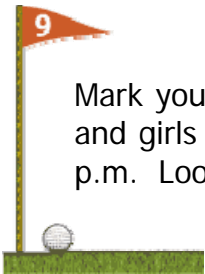

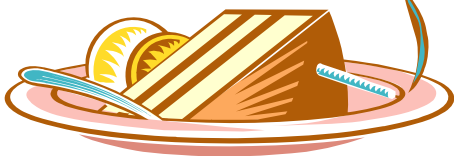

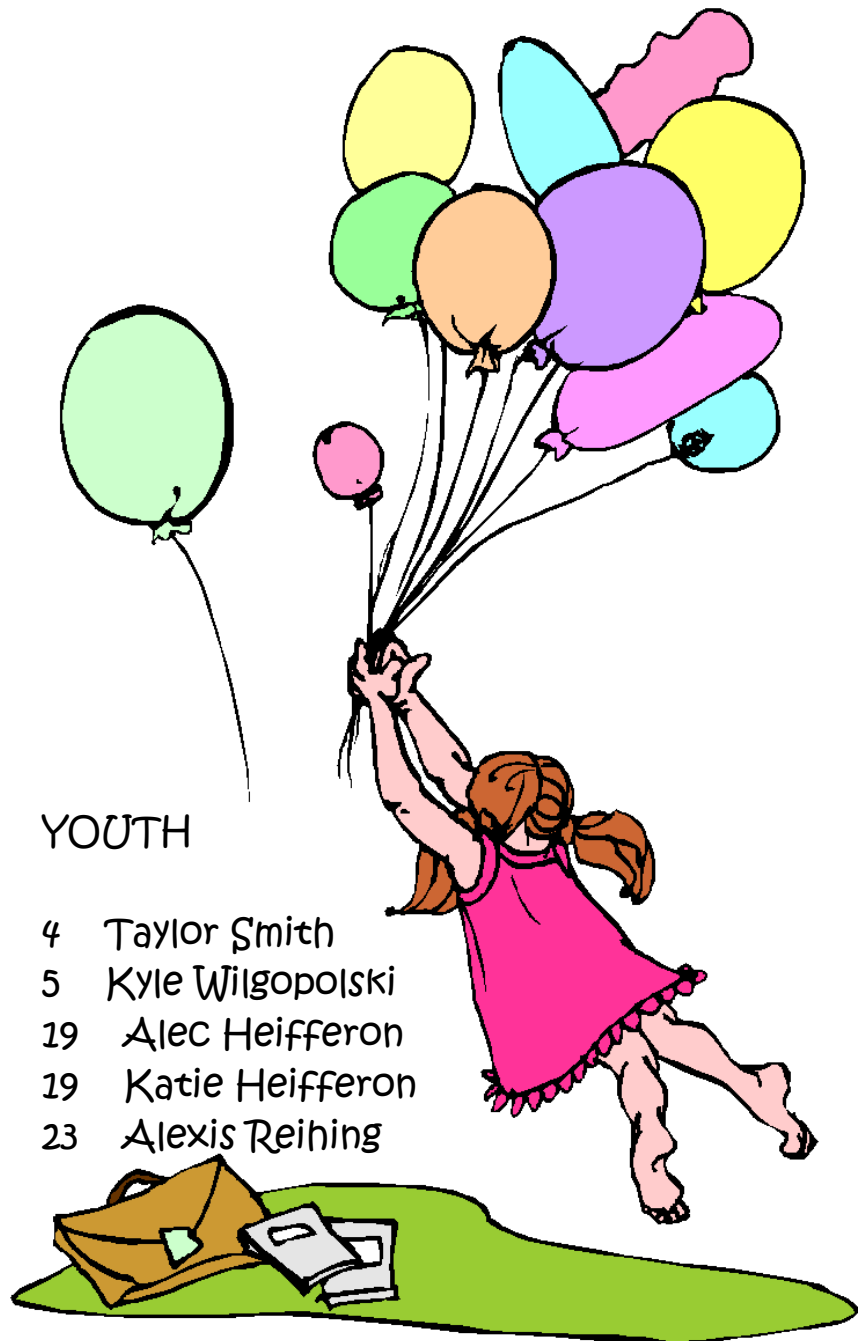
