FROM THE PASTOR'S PEN

Many of my recent morning devotions have centered on the importance and place of prayer. Perhaps you might find the one below to be a timely message for your own faith journey.

Prayer Saves Time

“So Peter was kept in prison, but the church was earnestly praying to God for him... “Peter motioned with his hand for them to be quiet and described how the Lord had brought him out of prison.” Acts 12:5, 17a

Prayer is a timesaver. It saves followers of Jesus from unnecessary seasons of anxious worry. It saves an employer from a wrong hire and the valuable investment of time, money and training in someone who does not stay around for very long. It saves a dating couple from a naive emotional engagement to marriage without counting the cost of a lifetime commitment to love, to respect and to serve each other. Prayer waits for God's best.

The flesh forces issues when prayer is void in the relational process. A person who is self-motivated, but not Spirit led exerts a lot of energy, but can waste a lot of time. A prayerless approach to life and work can easily end up in a focus on the urgent to the neglect of what really matters. Prayer protects you from the clenches of another's crisis.

“I was ashamed to ask the king for soldiers and horsemen to protect us from enemies on the road, because we had told the king, “The gracious hand of our God is on everyone who looks to him, but his great anger is against all who forsake him.” So we fasted and petitioned our God about this, and he answered our prayer” (Ezra 8:22-23).

Is prayer the primary focus in your decision making process? Do you rest in the realization that He can be trusted to reveal the way you should go? Do you realize that His truth—though at times counterintuitive—saves you time in the long run? What the Lord is saying may not make sense now, but later as you look back it becomes clearer.

It is not a copout to first pray before you commit—indeed it is a wise filter for decision-making. Our Lord Jesus smiles when His children take the time to save time, by waiting on His understanding in prayer. The prayerless crazy cycle of overreacting in fear and anger only prolongs the pain, while patient prayer applies heaven's healing process.

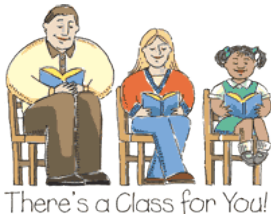
So the Lord's wisdom reminds us: Are you considering a career transition? Then ask God, what role in my work can I bring you the most glory? Are you facing a difficult financial decision? Then ask Christ, how should I manage Your resources as a wise steward? Are you estranged from a friend or relative? Pray, what can I do to love them in Jesus' name? Time is a gift from God that requires prayerful use and not fleshly abuse. So, pray well.

“While I was still in prayer, Gabriel, the man I had seen in the earlier vision, came to me in swift flight about the time of the evening sacrifice. He instructed me and said to me, “Daniel, I have now come to give you insight and understanding” (Daniel 9:21-22).

How can I create a culture of prayer in my life, my family and my work?¹

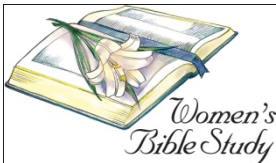


BIBLE STUDIES AND FELLOWSHIP TIMES

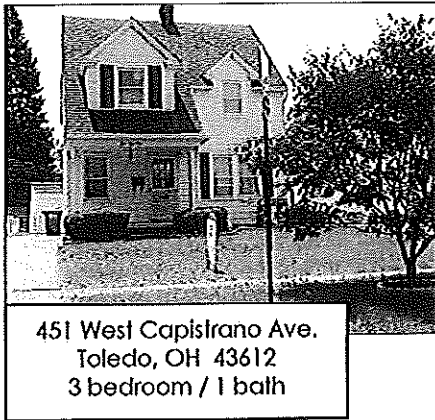

In 2007 eleven United Methodist Churches partnered to build a new home for a low income family. We laughed, hammered, made new friends, caulked, ate, insulated and painted. But most importantly we came together under our Methodist theology and had a profound impact on a family from our community. Our faith in action took a low-income family living in sub-standard housing in a dangerous neighborhood to a safe, affordable home that offered stability, peace of mind and self-confidence. We received many more blessings than we gave.

This year we will work side by side with Illana to help her and her family realize the same peace, stability and promise of a better future that home ownership offers.

In the wake of our recent recession, there are a number of foreclosed homes on the market. Maumee Valley Habitat for Humanity has purchased the foreclosed home pictured above. The following churches have made a commitment to share their time, talent and treasure to rehabilitate this home for a very deserving family: Epworth UMC; Maumee UMC; Oregon Faith UMC; St. Andrew's UMC; Toledo Hope UMC; Waterville UMC; and Whitehouse Hope UMC

The work schedule is being put together now by the Habitat people. Work is to start sometime in September.

Here are some of the projects that will need to be done – tear out carpet, tear out and remodel bathroom, remove out kitchen cabinets and install new ones, repair the roof, posts and base of the back porch, install new windows, clean exterior siding, garage renovation, painting, repair front porch, and landscaping. A little information about Illana, the Partner Family. Illana, along with her son, Quinlan, and daughter, Adore, were accepted into the program in December 2010. She is employed at Toledo Hospital in the dietary department. The family has been living in a townhouse in an area of town in which she has been feeling increasingly unsafe. Gang activity and shootings in her area have given her serious concern for the safety of her children. She has worked very hard on her sweat equity hours in a short amount of time, by participating in the different areas of our affiliate from the Restore, to the office, as well as participating in other families' builds. She has also completed a four week financial education program and has been attending the monthly Homeowner Education Program.

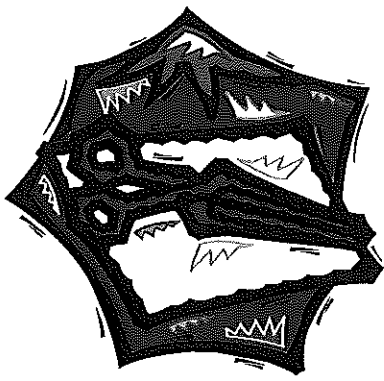

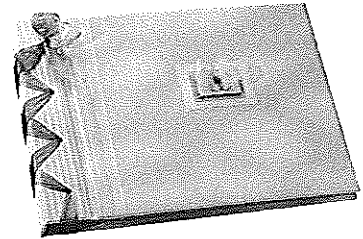
